## VALE David 'Flaker' Shaw

The Club is saddened to hear of the passing of Club Patron, life member and legend David A Shaw aged 93.



Historically there is no person more important at the N&CCC with his family link with the Hassetts as nephew of the legendary Vin, and Australian Test captain Lindsay - the club ran through his veins and pumped strongly for 75 years.

For over 75 years David Shaw has stood as a titan at the N&CCC from a schoolboy cricketer in the 1940s to club Patron in the 2020s.

Whilst brother John was representing Australia, David was developing as a talented batsman and went on to top 5000 runs with the club, half of those in the First XI where he played 154 of his 262 club matches.

But it will be as a man of vision for his club and his game for which he will long be remembered.

Slowly the club built through the 1950s as David led with the establishment of junior cricket in Geelong. He saw the club grow to six senior sides in the 70s, a dozen junior teams in 2010s, and Women's teams in the 2020s. David saw the club grow and enjoyed the successes. Yes, the 100 premierships and status as one of the great sporting clubs in the region.

He spent seasons as Secretary from 1948/49 in the foundation season when the Newtown & Chilwell Turf Cricket Club merged with the Newtown (matting) Cricket Club to form the N&CCC. He was 18 years of age.

He earned his 1st XI cap no 175 debuting in 1949/50. He went on to enjoy seven club premierships including four 1st XI flags.

20 seasons on the committee including 11 seasons as President from 1960/61 – the whole of the 1960s!

David Shaw loved Queen's Park.

He was instrumental in the club moving from Kardinia Park to Queen's Park.

When N&CCC was asked to leave Kardinia Park in the 1950s, it was David that led the delegation to the Newtown Council to make cricket a tenant at

Queen's Park. That meant the creation of a brand new cricket oval.

On October 15th, 1955, David Shaw faced the first ball to be bowled on the new ground, hitting it for four, and captained the club to the 1st XI premiership that summer after finishing last in the previous season.

Through Barwon floods and premierships, famine, the shifting the club from Kardinia Park to Queen's Park, the Golden Era to the Platinum Era, Foundation in 1948 to the Club's Centenary, David Shaw has been the one constant.

He also loved his football both on and off the hallowed turf as a player and administrator for the GAFNC.

David was part of the move to have Geelong Amateurs come as a co-tenant at Queens Park where in the 21st century both footballers and cricketers play on Shaw Oval, and Stinton (KFC) Oval.

When funding for the current clubrooms was being sought in the mid 1970s it was David Shaw whom the club turned to. He suddenly became president of six clubs (outside footy and cricket) including the Queen's Park Angling Club, all required to meet the funding guidelines.

Flaker always knew where the redfin were biting in the Barwon.

In recent decades there was the reassuring sight of his white ute parked

on the outskirts of Stinton (KFC) Oval as David Shaw completed the newspaper puzzles and enjoyed the rarefied air of Queen's Park.

And up the hill there was the long standing "Flaker's Corner" at the Diggers until the renovators moved it along.

...and finally as he oft would say, "When will the Council put the name board back on top of the entrance to Queen's Park?".

Maybe, that is something we can look at as a final tribute to this club legend.

David Shaw was acknowledged with the naming of Shaw Oval in his honour and will be always remembered as a pioneer and legend of the Newtown and Chilwell Cricket Club.

We were so lucky to have him, fortunate to enjoy his mentorship and leadership and blessed for his company.

Bob Merriman, Paul Anderson, Don Royce, Neville Crane, David Barnes, Russell Mitchell and many others were mentored by David as they too became influential administrators at the club, and in the Geelong region and beyond.

David Shaw's impact on the game he loved will continue long into the future.

# Thirds and Fourths take club championship points in season opener

**The Third XI** won the close one against Grovedale out there, while the Fourth XI had a huge win over the Tigers on Shaw Oval.

The Grovedale Third XI needed a six to win when Jacob Harmon, who had already bowled his leg-spin with great maturity, showed similar wisdom under the high ball to take the catch on the boundary that sealed six premierships points, and two club championship points.

Jacob was one of many players to earn the praise of Third XI captain, Andrew Knott, as his side showed plenty of grit and determination to stay in the match right to that last ball.

"It was a bit of a struggle," Andrew said, reflecting on the game as he walked his dog on Sunday morning.

"We were a bit like a bear coming out of hibernation, squinting in the sunshine, in terms of co-ordination and finesse.

"But we got the job done, mainly through the character of the players.

"Brendan Twaddle did some whacking at the end of our innings, Jarad did some whacking at the start.

"He's got a new year, a new body, and he's very fit.

"Scottie held things together in the middle overs along with a very composed Sam Meaney in his first game in the Third XI, and that allowed us to make a competitive score.

"When Grovedale batted, we got blown away a bit early by their openers and thought we were a bit behind but we were able to compose ourselves to a large degree.

"Lachie Norton got three wickets but could have had eight for all the dropped catches.

"The Grovedale batters could have told you all the patterns in the sky, they were always looking up when they played their shots.

"But we managed to slowly get back into the game.

"Aidan Grace bowled well and Jacob Harmon's four overs got a wicket as he bowled with maturity.

"Then he took the last catch on the fence with Grovedale needing six.

"It was good to get away with a win in round one, which doesn't always happen."

**The Fourth XI**, with Jordan White making his debut as captain, had a successful start to the season.

"We won the toss and batted first with both Sadowy's, Andrew and Madden scoring 43," Jordan said.

They were surpassed when a recount of the scorebook found that Mihir "The Rock" Patel had scored a half-century.

"Mihir was our rock, and we thought he had made 47, but a recount of the book found three more runs, but he didn't get to celebrate his half-century," Jordan said with a chuckle.

But, with his team-mates, he did get to celebrate six premierships points, and a club championship point, against a side replete with famous Grovedale names.

The skipper, too, made a handy contribution, 22, with four fours, to 9-221.

That proved defendable, and then some when Levi "Swervin' Mervyn" Irving took 5-18, five maidens among his nine overs.

"He was really moving it about, just nagging away, and he loves that 'Swervin' Mervyn' nickname," said a skipper pleased to have a bowler of Levi's qualities at his command.

Two other bowlers have qualities that also caught the eye of the skipper as the Fourth XI seeks to defend the premiership won last year.

Rather than nagging, it was full blown in your face stuff from Louis Povey and Jack Gordon as the captain set his fields and strategies accordingly.

"Jack Gordon terrified them, as did Louis Povey," Jordan said, "and we had plans for that."

By the time the skipper and Mihir had chipped in with a wicket apiece, Grovedale was well short ...all out for 103.

**At Burdoo Road, the First XI** had a first up loss as Grovedale, after losing early wickets, raced to 6-274, Nick Burke the best of the bowlers with two wickets and a canny hand in a run out.

In reply, with only Paddy McKenna (30) able to make good use of the short boundary on the grandstand side of the ground – three sixes in his top score of 30 – the Two Blues were dismissed for 89.

A wet wicket prevented **the Second XI** game on KFC Oval.

### Grovedale dominates over Newtown & Chilwell by Wes Cusworth

Grovedale has made an early statement of its 2023-24 intentions with an aggressive and emphatic 185-run defeat of Newtown and Chilwell at Burdoo Reserve.

Despite the loss of early wickets, the Tigers continued to attack the Two Blues' bowling with Michael McNeel (62 from 65) and Brayden Engelen-Baker (44 from 79), along with a brilliant unbeaten 92-ball 88 from Country Victoria all-rounder Jack Wrigglesworth, driving the home side through the bulk of the innings.

Nick Burke (2-50) toiled manfully, and Dylan Hodge (1-28) maintained tight lines, but just as a string of wickets worked the Combine back into the contest, Travis McDonald emerged at number eight to

bludgeon a 41-ball unbeaten 45 propelling the Tigers to an unassailable tally.

"Brayden and Micka (McNeel) set that innings up really well through the middle," an elated Wrigglesworth said in deflecting praise to teammates post-game.

"Newtown and Chilwell actually bowled really well through the middle of the innings but fortunately we were able to catch up in those last few overs to make a pretty good score.

"A lot of credit should go to Travis McDonald, the way that he was able to expand things towards the end." The visitors' response never really gained momentum after Wrigglesworth (1-6)

found the outside edge of Sam Mitchell's (4) bat and a steady procession of wickets followed.

Towering opener Pat McKenna went on the counter-attack with a blistering 19-ball 30 – peppered with three sixes – although the pace of firebrand Sam Coutts (3-15) and nagging lines of Travis McDonald (2-13) ensured that the Newtown and Chilwell batsmen were given few opportunities to challenge the Tigers' imposing tally.

Flamboyant spinner Bailey Sykes showed that he'll once again be a threat throughout this summer taking 2-8 from four overs.

"Ronnie has bags and bags of talent, and he's a lovely lad to match," Meredith said.

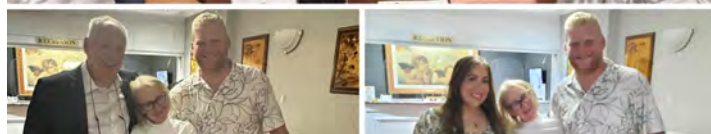
"I love the fact we have a relationship with Essex and we will look to continue that year upon year."

## Davis gains nod to take on Poms in 'Silver Ashes'

After about 40 summers out of the game, a Geelong veteran cricketer will make his Ashes debut in the United Kingdom in July.

Ian Davis, 70, has been selected for a 70-and-over

national squad to contest the "Silver Ashes", with 11 games scheduled against the UK, Wales and several counties from July 26 to August 22.

It caps off a triumphant return to the game for the former gun local footballer now bowling all-rounder, who

gave cricket away in his early 20s only to return to the sport about 40 summers later.

After retiring from playing and coaching football ("I'm probably a footy tragic") his cricket kit remained in the shed as Davis spent more time with his three daughters.

"I had a family I hadn't given much time to over the period of time so I didn't play cricket at all," he said.

However, he returned to the game about six years ago with the Geelong Seniors Cricket Club through a friend's invitation.

It has proven to be a terrific social outlet, with games played all over the state.

"For me it was about something social, it's a great way to socially connect when you're retired," he said. "It's a great little panacea for keeping healthy in all senses."

Davis said it was a "big surprise" to be called up to the national side after nominating himself, along with about 20 other Victorians, with Cricket Australia.

"I was very honoured and humbled," he said.

Davo took his against East Belmont in December 1976 in the Third XI which played that season in the Hedley Shield. His hattrick is quite unique with all batsmen dismissed LBW. Davo was a left arm medium bowler.
