

Tegs celebrates 100th game with a monster innings

Jordan Tegelhuter celebrated his 100th club game with a brazen innings of 82 not out from 33 balls to help the Two Blues secure six club championship points against perennial powerhouse East Belmont.

The Second XI captain won the toss and inserted and for the length of EB's innings of 114 the wicket seemed to have the same demons as the one produced at Winter Reserve for the Second XI grand final last March.

But more likely it was the always tantalising work of Jorden Lewis, ably supported by Harry Christie, also playing his 100th club game, and the kids, Sammy Taylor, Lachie Norton and Archie Fleet. Get used to playing on the grass fellas.

Certainly, the demons seemed to have been well and truly sent to purgatory when Tegs and his obdurate opening partner, Tim Hosking, held sway.

Tippy was nought not out when the score was 0-50, but inspired by the bloke at the other end, managed his own fours and a six, over cover no less.

Tegs' innings inspired folk on the sideline too.

David Norman, a bloke who has played with and against some of the greatest the game has produced, and with his tongue perhaps only slightly in his cheek, reckoned not even G. Pollock hit the ball as well as Tegs did.

Nine fours and seven sixes at a strike rate of 248.48 show that David had a point, as the Second XI secured six points for the win, and three championship points, via a 10-wicket win.

The class flowed through the Third XI's innings of 227, Charlie Windt top scoring with 70, Levi Irving – having the season of his young life – scoring 38, just shading the Charles Atlas of Newtown and Chilwell, Jared Battenally (37).

Fleetie and the skipper produced nice 20s in and among before the President and Mihir Patel (three wickets each) began unravelling the EB top order, with wicket-taking support from Levi and Twads ... all out 120.

The Fourth XI had an easy win, Lewis Povey bowling fast and straight – the first four batters all bowled – and finished with 6 for 21 from his allotted nine. There's something special about this bloke.

East Belmont's 68 was surpassed for the loss of two wickets, Andrew Sadowy (51 not out) whacking fours and sixes at will.

The First XI went down to EB, despite Noah Guida's first Michelle at this level (5 for 46) and some brave batting from Dylan Hodge (44 off 37 balls).

At times, the Two Blues looked in the chase to reach down 219, particularly with the skipper playing a lone hand with the tail, but eventually fell short.

In I went to the clubrooms and almost immediately this "bloke" came up to me, introduced himself as David Shaw and said to me, "You're most welcome. Let me show you our rooms and what we are all about at the Newtown & Chilwell Cricket Club."

From that moment I went from a "nervous visitor" to a most comfortable member.

This was for the most part due to the friendliness of David Shaw. Under David's guidance my life changed.

Over time I followed him onto the cricket field where again his cricket expertise was shared with all.

His leadership, skills on the cricket field and in the committee room, were infectious. My development in all facets of the game can be attributed to David.

Furthermore, his influence on mine and so many others' social life was remarkable. To this day, what initially commenced as "a beer at the Diggers after the game" where players and their friends met at The Gold Diggers Arms, has not ceased – 70 years later past players and friends still attend the venue on a weekly basis.

"Flaker" you will be missed by so many as a very good friend, teacher, and an inspirational leader and man.

I still hold deep respect for you David and thank you so much for being such a positive influence on my life.

Raelee and Tim both remember 'Flaker' fondly as 'the man in the corner' at the Diggers.

PREMIERSHIP DROUGHT BROKEN

The First Eleven, captained by Bob "Brown Arms" Merriman, had enjoyed a successful season and contained a blend of youthful enthusiastic players as well as experienced campaigners. In the grand final against South Barwon the opposition had been bundled out for 68 with the bowling honors shared by Barry Shaw (4/28) and Brian Edwards (4/17). Overnight Newtown/Chilwell was precariously placed at 5 for 28. Bruce Holden contributed an invaluable 22 but it was Greg Wells (20) and Graeme Rhodes (32 not out) who saw the team through to victory and the first premiership in twelve years.

It had been a long hard 12 seasons between the Golden Era of three consecutive flags until the next one arrived at Queen's Park in March of 1974.

The GCA had affectively brought an end to the *Golden Era* by introducing district boundaries for clubs, meaning that you had to reside within a club's boundary to play for a club.

NEWTOWN WIN IS 1ST IN 12 YEARS

The affect was immediate and disastrous for the club as it did not win another 1st XI match until February 10, 1964.

Premiership anniversaries – 1sts XI 1973/74

The GCA was taken to task by the Club on multiple occasions to change the rule but it wasn't until the mid 1960s that the rule was changed.

'Brown Arms' Merriman had in 1965 taken over as the GCA President and eventually abolished the former district boundaries rules as one of his prime objectives.

Season 1973/74 saw the 1sts XI come from narrowly missing the finals the previous year by 0.03% to lose just one of 12 matches (to Geelong West) and win the flag. Debutantes included Michael Bowtell and Bruce Holden along with Warwick 'Butch' Oman. Bowtell's century on debut was the first of his eight Ones tons. Of course, he went on to be one of the GCA's all time greats scoring 4680 runs at 46.34 with eight premierships.

Bruce Holden celebrated by winning the inaugural GJ Donovan Duck Award thus becoming 'Golden' Holden.

Butch Oman was later to become the only man in the club's history to have an umpire upgrade his dismissed 99 to 100 by changing a leg bye in his favour!

On February 28 Greg Wells single headedly defeated Leopold making 85 runs and taking 7 for 31 from 19 overs, 7 maidens. The Goose later became the GCA's greatest wicket taker with 574 wickets at 14.82. The '73/74 flag was his first of 9 in the Ones.

Bowtell won the '73/74 club batting average with 532 runs at 76, he also won the GCA batting award. Wells the club bowling average with 20 wickets at 12.5.

A youthful Stephen Lunn was part of a younger group in the premiership side

which also included five future members of the club's *Team of the Century – Merriman, Bowtell, Wells, Paul Anderson, Brian Edwards and*

The 17 year old Lunn along with Goose (21) and Ken Le Hunt (22) provided the youthful exuberance.

Allrounders Graeme 'Dusty' Rhodes and President Brian Edwards completed the premiership XI.

Skipper Bob Merriman along with 'keeper Paul Anderson, seamer Barry Shaw and paceman and Caricaturist extraordinaire Mike "Curly' Mitton had endured 12 seasons of premiership drought since the *Golden Era*. Mitton having returned to the club the previous season after a successful stint in Melbourne District Cricket




